24	1. Laura Zuniga (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Landscape Architects		
25	Technical Committee (Committee). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is		
26	represented in this matter by Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by		
27	David E. Hausfeld, Deputy Attorney General.

1	2. Respondent Thomas Karl Doczi (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding by			
2	attorney David L. Baron of Slovak Baron Empey Murphy & Pinkney LLP, whose address is:

4	3. On or about December 30, 1983, the California State Board of Landscape Architects			
5	issued Landscape Architect License Number LA 2370 to Respondent. The Landscape Architect			
6	License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No.			
7	LA 2016-14 and will expire on February 28, 2019, unless renewed.			
8	JURISDICTION			
9	4. Accusation No. LA 2016-14 was filed before the California Architects Board			
10	(Board), and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily			
11	required documents were properly served on Respondent on November 29, 2017. Respondent			
12	timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation.			
13	5. A copy of Accusation No. LA 2016-14 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated			
.14	herein by reference.			
15	ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS			
16	6. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the			
17	charges and allegations in Accusation No. LA 2016-14. Respondent has also carefully read, fully			
18	discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary			
19	Order.			
20	7. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a			
21	hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine			
22	the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right			
ż3	to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of			
24	documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other			
25	rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.			
26	8. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and			
27	every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

9. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation 2 No. LA 2016-14. 3

Respondent agrees that his Landscape Architect License is subject to discipline and 10. he agrees to be bound by the Board's probationary terms as set forth in the Disciplinary Order 5 below. 6

CONTINGENCY

This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the California Architects Board. 11. 8 Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Landscape 9 Architects Technical Committee may communicate directly with the Board regarding this 10 stipulation and settlement, without notice to or participation by Respondent or his counsel. By 11 signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his 12 agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. 13 If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Settlement and 14 Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible 15 16 in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter. 17

The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile 18 12. copies of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order, including PDF and facsimile 19 signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals. 20

13. This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order is intended by the parties to be an 21 integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. 22 It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, 23 24 negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a 25 writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties. 26

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14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
 the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following
 Disciplinary Order:
 <u>DISCIPLINARY ORDER</u>
 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Landscape Architect License No. LA 2370 issued to
 Respondent Thomas Karl Doczi is revoked. However, the revocation is stayed and Respondent is
 placed on probation for five (5) years on the following terms and conditions.

Obey All Laws. Respondent shall obey all federal, state and local laws and
 regulations governing the practice of landscape architecture in California.

Submit Quarterly Reports. Respondent, within ten (10) days of completion of the
 quarter, shall submit quarterly written reports to the Board on a Quarterly Report of Compliance
 form obtained from the Board.

3. **Personal Appearances.** Upon reasonable notice by the Board, Respondent shall report to and make personal appearances at times and locations as the Board may direct.

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4. Cooperate During Probation. Respondent shall cooperate fully with the Board, and
with any of its agents or employees in their supervision and investigation of his compliance with
the terms and conditions of this probation. Upon reasonable notice, Respondent shall provide the
Board, its agents or employees, with the opportunity to review all plans, specifications, and
instruments of service prepared during the period of probation.

Tolling for Out-of-State Practice, Residence or In-State Non-Practice. In the 5. 20 21 event Respondent should leave California to reside or to practice outside the State or for any reason stop practicing landscape architecture in California, Respondent shall notify the Board or 22 its designee in writing within ten (10) days of the dates of departure and return, or the dates of 23 non-practice or the resumption of practice within California. Non-practice is defined as any 24 period of time exceeding thirty (30) days in which Respondent is not engaging in any activities 2:5 26 defined in Section 5615 of the Business and Professions Code. All provisions of probation other than the quarterly report requirements, examination requirements, and education requirements, 27 shall be held in abeyance until Respondent resumes practice in California. All provisions of 28

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probation shall recommence on the effective date of resumption of practice in California. Periods
 of temporary or permanent residency or practice outside California or of non-practice within
 California will not apply to the reduction of this probationary period.

6. Violation of Probation. If Respondent violates probation in any respect, the Board, after giving Respondent notice and opportunity to be heard, may revoke probation and carry out the disciplinary order which was stayed. If an accusation or a petition to revoke probation is filed against Respondent during probation, the Board shall have continuing jurisdiction until the matter is final, and the period of probation shall be extended until the matter is final.

9 7. Completion of Probation. Upon successful completion of probation, Respondent's
10 license will be fully restored.

8. Notification to Clients. Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Decision,
Respondent shall provide all clients with whom he has a current contractual relationship in the
practice of landscape architecture with a copy of the Decision and Order of the Board and provide
the Board with evidence of such notification, including the name and address of each person or
entity required to be notified.

9. Cost Reimbursement. Respondent shall reimburse the Board \$4,517.50 for its
investigative and prosecution costs. The payment shall be made as follows: in equal monthly
payments, the final payment being due one year before probation is schedule to terminate. The
first payment shall be made within thirty (30) days of the date the Board's decision is final.

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ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the above Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order and have fully discussed it with my attorney, David L. Baron. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Landscape Architect License.
